Chipping crews will be provided to chip vegetation in Firewise Communities or neighborhoods with at least 8 homes participating in fuel reduction. Residents are responsible for cutting, gathering, and piling vegetation from around their homes to a roadside or drop-off location.

Things to know:

- 1. Limbs, brush, shrubs, and small trees up to 6" diameter and a maximum of 10 feet in length.
- 2. Please no grass, hay, leaves, palm fronds, or individual pieces weighing more than 80 lbs. No staples, nails, barbed wire, vines, poison oak, bamboo or fencing of any kind.
- 3. Stack cut stems parallel to the roadway, facing the same direction so the crews do not have to untangle the stems.
- 4. Place items within 10 feet of the roadside and off the pavement in a manner that does not interfere with traffic flow or visibility along the roadside. Piles should not be located on steep hillsides or areas unsafe for personnel. Piles are not to exceed 4 feet in height. Personnel will not carry material beyond 10 feet.
