DOOR HANGER DISTRIBUTION



OBJECTIVE

To distribute door hanger notifications to every house in Kensington, reminding residents to prepare for wildfire.

Distribution will begin on July 24th and can be completed at your leisure by August 13th.





MATERIALS


Each area will have an allocation of door hangers inside a drawstring bag. These bags will be distributed to volunteers on July 22nd from 10-12pm at Kensington Park at the end of Windsor Ave. Look for the Kensington Fire District PopUp Tent.

We can arrange other plans if you are unable to pick the materials up on 7/22.

Each bag will also have a map for the area and a list of home addresses for reference.



DISTRIBUTION AREA



Kensington is broken up into 5 zones as seen here in the Zonehaven map.

Smaller areas were established from these zones to assign distribution assignments.


Please note, some assignments cross into different zones.

AREAS

Here is an example of an area map to distribute door hangers. This area is called AMHERST, which contains 98 homes.

Suggested starting points are marked with red circles and are optional starting points.

An area map will be provided in the material bag for the respective area for the volunteer.



SAFETY

Each volunteer will be sent a safety acknowledgment via e-mail.

- Please be safe when crossing streets. Look for traffic before crossing.
- Wear closed-toe shoes appropriate for walking.
- Stay hydrated and cool- and wear clothing that makes you visible.

TIPS

Some homes have a front door inside a gated yard. You can hang the door hanger on the gate into the yard.

Some homes may have confusing layouts where the entrance is not obvious as you approach it. You can hang the door hanger on a prominent visible railing, or mailbox as an efficient solution.

Some homes may also have long staircases to lead to the front door- if there's a railing you can secure the door hanger to the rail.
